8. DISCUSSION ONLY (No Action - No Public Comment): Committee/Staff Reports

Fire District

- Fire Chief Jeremy Loncar said that on Jan. 31 he attended the Fire Academy graduation ceremonies for 3 new Storey County fire fighters.
- Next week he will attend the Ignites Symposium, which will cover many subjects including issues with homeowner's insurance coverage.
- The Nevada Fire Chiefs Association has 15 bills they are monitoring.
- The district will have prescribed burns tomorrow through Thursday in the Highlands. These are small pile burnings. They will keep the public informed through social media.

Operations and Projects

• Coordinator Mike Northan said the Lockwood Senior Center project was progressing well.

• The Fairgrounds project bid was suspended due to the Buy American, Build American Act. Mr. Northan said he needs to coordinate with other agencies before resuming the process.

Emergency Management

- Director Adam Wilson gave a progress review of the department covering 2023-2024. In July 23, this was a one-person shop, now we are certified in the state. We have worked on regional cooperation. He said his department:
 - Brought emergency planning in-house, saving \$180,000 per year.
 - Held numerous community outreach meetings.
 - Conducted tabletop emergency management exercises.
 - Successfully applied for grants for fire district and sheriff's office.
 - Assisted Carson City on Nevada Day.
 - Increased software capabilities improving mass communication.
 - Helped with the Davis Fire and with power outages in the Highlands.
 - Received grants for first-aid kits in county vehicles.
 - Updated the hazard mitigation plans.
 - Created a safety committee.
 - Worked with various agencies and groups, including the Storey County School District, the Fire District, and Community Chest.
 - Created an evacuation and shelter manual.
 - Conducted training on active shooter situations.
 - Created a long-term recovering plan manual and storm disaster recovery process.
 - Partnered with business and other local governments to expand preparedness.
 - Has attended conferences and symposia to enhance knowledge and capability.

Health and Community Services

- Stacy York said her department served 5,510 congregate meals, 25,071 home-delivered meals, and 20,000 meals between the schools and the jail.
- The kitchen in VC produces over 50,000 meals a year
- Homemaker hours have remained consistent at 600 a year
- Transportation has provided 3,200 rides for 160 different people.
- Food pantries in VC served 105 people in 2024, an increase from 50 in 2023; Mark Twain served 169 people, an increase from 114, and Lockwood served 250 people, an increase from 205.

Public Information

- Public Information Officer Julia Moreno-Fritz said the Storey County commercial is airing on Nevada Newsmakers
- She is working on Google ads and will be writing stories for the Comstock Chronicle.

County Manager

• County Manager Austin Osborne said the Storey County housing plan is complete and will be sent to the governor. He said there is a substantial amount of housing built along I80, and the county included information on "attainable" housing.

Planning Commission

• Commissioner Lee Sterrett expanded on his public comment regarding his attendance at the meeting of the Nevada Water Resources Association. He said there are 256 groundwater basins in Nevada as of 2019, and 50 percent were fully or over-committed. Nevada received a \$25 million dollar grant to buy back water rights in basins which were over-committed and over-pumped. The grant was for 2,500 acre-feet of water rights, which were then retired.

Community Chest

- Eric Schoen said the expansion of the early childhood education center was nearly ready after sprinklers and fireproof doors are installed.
- The Community Chest receives federal funding, and if those funds are delayed or cut, the organization has funds to keep operations going for at least six months. The CCI is developing contingency plans if funds are cut, and all programs remain open.

9. BOARD COMMENT (No Action - No Public Comment): None

Human Resources Manager Brandie Lopez said she wants to establish a relationship to meet demands and time limits the County is currently experiencing with existing contracts and grants. This is for temporary labor. The County can adjust the workforce as needed. This is a new company.

County Manager Austin Osborne said to get the projects done and meeting the timelines of the grants, we looked at other companies and looked at doing it in-house, and Actalent provided the best return on money and effort.

Motion: I, Commissioner Mitchell, move to approve the County Manager to sign and enter a contract with Actalent for the provision of temporary construction staffing services to help meet project deadlines not to exceed \$165,000. **Seconded by:** Donald Gilman. **Vote:** Motion passed unanimously.

DISCUSSION/FOR POSSIBLE ACTION: Consideration and possible approval to authorize the County Manager to approve and sign a contract addendum between Storey County and Cintas Corporation No. 2, doing business as Cintas First Aid & Safety, for an additional AED to be located at the Storey County Community Development Office.

Administrative Officer Lisa Maciel said this is to add another AED to the development office. The closest one to this office is at Public Works.

Motion: I, Commissioner Mitchell, move to authorize the County Manager to approve and sign an addendum to the contract between Storey County and Cintas Corporation No. 2, doing business as Cintas First Aid & Safety, to add an additional AED to the contract to be placed in the Community Development Office. Under this contract, Cintas will supply Storey County with Automatic External Defibrillators, along with related products and services for an additional \$126.00 per month. **Seconded by:** Donald Gilman. **Vote:** Motion passed unanimously.

12. DISCUSSION/FOR POSSIBLE ACTION: Consideration and Possible approval of Grant of Easement file 2025-017 from Storey County to NV Energy for Utility Facilities within the C Street Right-of-Way near Flowery Street, Virginia City, Storey County, Nevada to facilitate project development.

Planning Manager Kathy Canfield said this is a request from NVEnergy to provide service, between an area that NDOT considers their right-of-way and private property.

Motion: In accordance with the recommendation by staff, I, Commissioner Mitchell, move to approve Grant of Easement 2025-017 from Storey County to NV Energy for Utility Facilities within the C Street Right-of-Way near Flowery Street, Virginia City, Storey County, Nevada to facilitate project development. **Seconded by:** Donald Gilman. **Vote:** Motion passed unanimously.

13. DISCUSSION/FOR POSSIBLE ACTION: Discussion and possible approval of County staff regarding pending federal appropriation requests for federal fiscal year 2025, and dependent on the passage of the 2025 federal fiscal year budget, federal appropriation proposals for federal fiscal year 2026.

Grants Manager Sara Sturtz said the county submitted 4 requests. Two were included in 2025 - the mobile emergency command center and Divide water project. If Congress passes another continuing resolution after March14, we will seek to prepare for either re-submitting

these as well as requests for Piper's Opera House, the public safety complex, the Silver City water main line replacement, and the Courthouse earthquake retrofit.

Motion: I, Commissioner Mitchell, move to approve County staff to proceed with submitting the 2026 federal appropriation requests for the Virginia City Public Safety Complex, Silver City Water Main Line Replacement, Courthouse Earthquake Retrofit, and the resubmission of the Historic Piper's Opera House West Wall Restoration and A Street Roadway Improvement, and, if a continuing resolution necessitates resubmission of 2025 requests, to submit the Mobile Emergency Command Center, Divide Water Main Replacement, the Historic Piper's Opera House West Wall Restoration and A Street Roadway Improvement, and the Virginia City Public Safety Complex. **Seconded by:** Donald Gilman. **Vote:** Motion passed unanimously.

14. DISCUSSION/FOR POSSIBLE ACTION: Consideration and possible approval to authorize Storey County Business Development to reallocate an amount not to exceed \$4,000 of budgeted and available funds from the Professional Services account to host regional attendees at the National Association of Counties annual Legislative conference.

Business Development Officer Lara Mather said this happened last year, with the Nevada Association of Counties as the host, and Storey County as the sponsor. It allowed us to have a captive audience of Nevada staff, officials and elected representatives and was very successful. Ms. Mather has reached out to host another dinner the first week of March.

Public Comment: None

Motion: I, Commissioner Mitchell, move to approve the authorization for Storey County Business Development to re-allocate an amount not to exceed \$4,000 of budgeted and available funds from the Professional account to host regional attendees at the National Association of Counties annual Legislative conference. **Seconded by:** Donald Gilman. **Vote:** Motion passed unanimously.

15. DISCUSSION/FOR POSSIBLE ACTION: Consideration and possible approval to authorize Storey County Business Development to author and submit a letter supporting SB5 to make the Lieutenant Governor's Office of Small Business Advocacy (OSBA) a permanent fixture within the Office of the Lieutenant Governor.

Ms. Mather said OSBA was created in the 2021 legislative session. The original bill has a 2year sunset. SB5 takes that bill and gets ride of the sunset date. She has worked with this office, providing resource fairs, town halls and forums. She said it is an important resource. Commissioner Mitchell was unsure about how much regulatory friction could come about in the future. Ms. Mather said there was talk of moving this under GOED, but Staff wants it to stay under the Lt. Governor's Office to avoid conflict.

Public Comment: None

Motion: I, Commissioner Mitchell, move to authorize Storey County Business Development to author and submit a letter supporting SB5 to make the Lieutenant Governor's Office of Small Business Advocacy (OSBA) a permanent fixture within the Office of the Lieutenant Governor. **Seconded by:** Donald Gilman. **Vote:** Motion passed unanimously.

16. DISCUSSION ONLY: Storey County FY25 2nd Quarter Financial Review.

Comptroller Jennifer McCain said this is a final financial review of the second quarter. At midpoint the General Fund is tracking at 82 percent of revenue, slightly higher than last year. Ad valorem is at 79 percent. We expect that to level off in the 3rd and 4th quarters. One of the highest is building permits, now at 148 percent collected. This is due to Tesla paying for building permits now and an increased number of data centers. Countywide revenues are at 65 percent collected with most funds performing as expected. General Fund expenditures are 42 percent of plan. Of the expenditures, 41 percent are wages, and 32 percent are benefits. With merit wage increases coming soon and new benefit negotiations, those may increase before fiscal year-end. All departments are trending at or below expectations.

Ms. McCain said most funds were reported as anticipated, except earned interest which the Clerk & Treasurer's Office is working to get up to date. She enumerated specific funds and their current needs, but said some higher numbers do not worry her department. All departments and funds are actively monitored.

Public Comment: None

17. DISCUSSION ONLY: County Manager to provide a quarterly report to the board.

County Manager Austin Osborne said this is a quarterly report on what is going on administratively.

- Legislative matters: working with Julia and the team to implement commercials and online promotion. We are putting booklets together for the Legislature.
- Community Development: code enforcement is a new activity in the office. About 33 average nuisance complaints per month are received, 2.66 per month are abated, 12.5 percent of them are complying, and 33 percent are in the criminal nuisance prevention program. Building inspections are up and the county may have to adopt the new International Code Council regulations.
- Capital Improvement Plan: projects totaling multi-millions of dollars are being scheduled so Treasury/Comptroller can prepare to have money on hand. Staffing and contract

assistance requirements are being planned. He said the jail project must be done, water infrastructure and the Road Improvement Plan. We are doing a facilities' needs assessment, looking at future needs, and developing a plan.

- Piper's Opera House: we are still working with the respondent on that, and what is complicated about that is that there are major key structural elements that are not part of rehabilitation, but beams and pillars, and all this has contract implications.
- County Transfer Station: based on the school district's unified schools plan, the County is investigating a plan to move the Transfer Station to the old dump off of Six Mile Canyon. There are Nevada Division of Environmental Protection issues, Superfund matters, and ingress/egress safety issues to be overcome.
- Budget: departments are planning next year's needs. We are looking at bringing in a staff engineer, as everything is getting more complex.
- Comstock Cemetery Foundation: the Memorandum of Understanding is still in place and we need to do an expansion of the area available as there are only 35 plots left.
- Marlette Water Plan: we are in discussions with the state and still have an MOU in place.
- Planning Department: the housing needs assessment is being done, along with updating zoning and other ordinances.
- Capital Improvement Plan: a few major projects include for Virginia City are the broadband project, water system upgrades, B Street waterline and paving project, and O Street drainage. For TRI Center, Station 75, Emergency Management office, Electric Avenue traffic signal, and flood mitigation planning. For the Highlands, the Lousetown Road Project, the community center cleanup and upgrade and broadband will be next. For Lockwood, the sheriff's substation is done, the community center and flood mitigation planning. For Mark Twain, drainages and culverts and roads. A reader board will be at the community center, which will be rehabilitated, and then the truck turn-around.

18. RECESS TO CONVENE AS THE STOREY COUNTY WATER AND SEWER BOARD

19. DISCUSSION/FOR POSSIBLE ACTION: Consideration and possible approval to purchase 3 new Laser Turbidimeters and 4 new SC4500 Controllers for the water filters at the Water Treatment Plant in the amount of \$32,281.35 with SCADA programming not to exceed \$5,000 for a grand total of \$37,281.35.

Public Works Director Jason Wierzbicki said the County's turbidimeters are obsolete. New ones will measure the particulates in the water to optimize water filter performance and chemical dosage and disinfection.

Public Comment: None

Motion: I, Commissioner Mitchell, move to approve the purchase of 3 new Laser Turbidimeters and 4 new SC4500 Controllers for the water filters at the Water Treatment

Plant in the amount of \$32,281.35 with SCADA programming not to exceed \$5,000 for a grand total of \$37,281.35. **Seconded by:** Donald Gilman. **Vote:** Motion passed unanimously.

20. DISCUSSION ONLY: Water-Sewer FY25 2nd Quarter Financial Review.

Comptroller Jennifer McCain said funds are trending as we expected at about 50 percent of plan. Water is at 52 percent collected for services; Sewer is at 48 percent. Overall, there is a concern the budget for rates is not supporting ongoing operations. Expenses for both of these funds are trending slightly below expectations, with 64 percent available in the Water Fund and 61 percent available in the Sewer Fund. Wages and benefits are tracking as expected. We are always trying to increase the ending fund balances for both funds.

Public Comment: None

21. RECESS TO CONVENE AS THE STOREY COUNTY FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT BOARD

22. DISCUSSION ONLY: Fire District FY25 2nd Quarter Financial Review.

Ms. McCain said for the second quarter review, the Fire District has collected almost 90 percent of the planned budgeted revenue, but that will level out due to Ad Valorem collection, just like the County budget. There is a significantly high collection rate for building permits due to Tesla now paying for permits and increased data facilities. This, however, can change at any time. Expenses are tracking to plan at 38 percent usage, as expected. Transfer and budget augmentations still must be addressed. The Fire District Capital Fund will have a deficiency due to the recent property acquisition for the TRIC station. Mutal Aid fund for out-of-district fires revenues are tracking to plan. The Capital Fund has large pieces of equipment that are on order which will roll over in to future fiscal plans until more reasonable delivery dates are set. We will still need transfers and augmentations for this fund. We expect to see significant changes to these plans as the chief builds out on the new property.

Public Comment: None

23. DISCUSSION/FOR POSSIBLE ACTION: Consideration and possible approval for policy P603 Sick Leave and policy P602 Annual Leave with modifications allowing leave buyout amounts at the time of retirement to be utilized to purchase PERS service credits.

Fire Chief Jeremy Loncar said on both policies, if approved, the effective date would be today. There are a lot of retirements coming up. Involved HR consultant Jeanne Green on this. New firefighters mean cost savings.

Public Comment: None

Motion: I, Fire Commissioner Mitchell, move to approve the modifications to policy P603 Sick Leave and policy P602 Annual Leave. **Seconded by:** Donald Gilman. **Vote:** Motion passed unanimously.

24. DISCUSSION/FOR POSSIBLE ACTION: Consideration and possible approval to dispose of by means of auction, donation, sale, or trade-in, of a 2006 Yukon and a 2006 Ford F350 Dozer tender.

Chief Loncar said both units need replacement. He said the Yukon went to the County for an emergency management vehicle. Dozer tender is going to auction. It has been a money pit.

Public Comment: None

Motion: I, Fire Commissioner Mitchell, move to approve the disposal of a 2006 Yukon and a 2006 Ford F350 Dozer tender by means of auction, donation, sale, or trade-in. **Seconded by:** Donald Gilman. **Vote:** Motion passed unanimously.

25. RECESS TO CONVENE AS THE STOREY COUNTY HIGHWAY BOARD

26. DISCUSSION/FOR POSSIBLE ACTION: Election of Secretary to the Board of Storey County Highway Commissioners for the term of one year.

County Manager Austin Osborne said this is to choose which of you would like to serve. Commissioner Mitchell is the incumbant.

Public Comment: None

Motion: I, Commissioner Mitchell, move to elect myself as the Secretary to the Board of Storey County Highway Commissioners for the term of one year. **Seconded by:** Donald Gilman. **Vote:** Motion passed unanimously.

27. DISCUSSION ONLY: Report of Public Works Department regarding roads and highways throughout Storey County.

Public Works Director Jason Wierzbicki said he:

- Met with DOWL over last few weeks regarding the full reconstruction on B street and Union Street. There is no base under any of these roads. The cost was \$3.3 million and is now \$4.7 million.
- We are working on the Six Mile Canyon Turnaround Project.
- We are working on the Road Capital Improvement Program for the next 4 years.

Public Comment: None

28. RECESS TO RECONVENE AS THE STOREY COUNTY BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

29. DISCUSSION/FOR POSSIBLE ACTION: Discussion and possible consideration approving the Storey County Sheriff's Office receipt of a Grant from the State of Nevada Department of Public Safety, Office of Criminal Justice Assistance in the amount of \$30,836.64, Federal Award# 1 SPBJA-21-GG-00252-MUMU, to be used for travel and equipment purchase of 2 drug detection K9s and miscellaneous costs associated with this purchase.

Sheriff Mike Cullen said this the first part of two-part grant, awarding \$30,836.64 from the Nevada Department of Public Safety, Office of Criminal Justice Assistance to purchase 2 drug detection K9s, and related travel and misc. costs associated with this purchase. These funds will be used along with other grant funds to establish our drug detection K9 program. The unbudgeted revenues and expenses for this grant will be accounted for in the County's Grant Fund and may possibly create the need for an augmentation or transfer at the end of the year.

Commissioner Gilman supported the program, but asked, this is for 2 canine units. The existing dog is donated. He said he has worked with canines and thinks dogs de-escalate situations. He noted a lot of drug issues along USA Parkway.

Commissioner Mitchell asked how the canines would be used. Sheriff Cullen reiterated they were drug detection dogs, which currently must be requested for support from regional law enforcement agencies, causing a delay. He said they could be used for businesses, schools or anyone else who asks for assistance. They could also be used for traffic stops.

As to ancillary costs, Sheriff Cullen said the grant is re-occurring. We will have a line-item of \$5,000. We are happy with the donations for the existing dogs for food and care. He said there may have to be modifications to vehicles to accommodate the new dogs.

The sheriff also said that the Courts have ruled that if the dog hits on a vehicle, that gives the deputy probable cause to search the vehicle without a warrant. He said a fentanyl drug house was raided, just 20 feet from the middle school.

Commissioner Carmona asked about the conditions for the grant. Sheriff Cullen said the funds must be spent quickly. He heard of three dogs, but Sheriff Cullen said Lux is the only volunteer dog. Deputy Jessup has paid for training himself. He said that if the grants end, the dogs could be retired, most likely staying with their handlers, but younger, newer dogs last longer. There are two vehicles capable of carrying dogs. The grant funds are for the one-time purchase of the dogs and the training to get them started.

Commissioner Carmona was concerned about handler costs or other costs. Sheriff Cullen said that was included in the grant. Commissioner Carmona said he would like to see better numbers for any risks to the county, including modification for cars, POOL/PACT insurance.

In response to questions from Commissioner Gilman, Sheriff Cullen said the dogs would belong to the county, and if the grant was discontinued the dogs could be retired.

Commissioner Mitchell suggested continuing the item for more information.

Comptroller Jennifer McCain said there could be unbudgeted costs, such as 5 percent to the deputy that becomes the handler \$3,000 per person or more. She also asked when the dogs would be ready and if revenue would come from this investment. Sheriff Cullen said the dogs will be ready when they are purchased, then training for the officers and should be ready by mid-summer. He said dogs are a deterrent, but not a revenue source. He said they were lifesaving, as that day meth and fentanyl were found on an employee at Tesla. He noted other cases as well.

Public Comment: None

Motion: I, Commissioner Mitchell, move to continue this item to our next scheduled commission meeting and ask the sheriff to provide a cost breakdown as to what the fiscal impact would be should these grants not be in the picture, and any other anticipated ongoing costs. **Seconded by:** Donald Gilman. **Vote:** Motion passed unanimously.

30. DISCUSSION/FOR POSSIBLE ACTION: Discussion and possible consideration approving the Storey County Sheriff's Office to receive a grant from the State of Nevada Department of Public Safety, Office of Criminal Justice Assistance in the Amount of \$15,000, Federal Award Number 1 SPBJA-22-GG-00625-MUMU to be used for training and travel and misc. equipment indicated as other for deputies assigned to the Storey County Sheriff's Office Drug Initiative Program.

Sheriff Cullen said this is part two of what we just finished discussing.

Public Comment: None

Motion: I, Commissioner Mitchell, move to continue this item as well to our next regularly scheduled meeting on Feb. 18, 2024, for consideration. **Seconded by:** Donald Gilman. **Vote:** Motion passed unanimously.

31. DISCUSSION/FOR POSSIBLE ACTION: Discussion and consideration approving the Storey County Sheriff's Office to receive one Humvee 4-wheel-drive vehicle Serial Number 1 4016NV00004 from the Douglas County Sheriff's Office through the State of Nevada 1 033

LESO program for use as a Search and Rescue Vehicle as well as use in parades and for community outreach events.

Sheriff Cullen said Douglas County had this vehicle and it is now offered through the state. He wanted to fix it up and use it for search and rescue, along with the Fire District. He plans on using the United We Stand grant to pay for it. The commissioners discussed costs, and Sheriff Cullen said he was also concerned, but planned on using it for public events as well as search and rescue. He said he would rather a free vehicle get banged up rather than one the County paid for. He said some OHVs are limited in use for search and rescue. This vehicle can carry quite a few people along with equipment and can pull a vehicle out of a difficult area. He said much of the work will be done by volunteers.

County Manager Austin Osborne said it was important to make sure auxiliary vehicles are not a burden on the shop.

Commissioner Carmona said he didn't like Humvees as they were expensive to maintain. He was concerned about the impression more vehicle/equipment purchases leave on constituents.

Commissioner Gilman suggested continuing this to the next meeting.

Public Comment: None

Motion: I, Commissioner Mitchell, move to continue this item regarding the donation of a Humvee vehicle to the Sheriff's Office from the Douglas County Sheriff's Office to our next regularly scheduled meeting on Feb. 18. **Seconded by:** Donald Gilman. **Vote:** Motion passed unanimously.

32. DISCUSSION/FOR POSSIBLE ACTION: Consideration and possible approval to reappoint Scott Jolcover to a 4-year term on the Storey County Board of Equalization.

Clerk & Treasurer Jim Hindle said this is to address the re-appointment of Scott Jolcover to a four-year term to the board, which hears appeals to property assessments.

Public Comment: None

Motion: I, Commissioner Mitchell, move to reappoint Scott Jolcover for a 4-year term on the Storey County Board of Equalization. **Seconded by:** Donald Gilman. **Vote:** Motion passed unanimously.

33. DISCUSSION/FOR POSSIBLE ACTION: Consideration and possible approval to accept a quote from Coons Construction for site improvements at 800 South C Street to provide sidewalk widening for ADA compliance, bollards for building protection, and a flagpole in

an amount not to exceed \$21,478.00 and to authorize the County Manager to sign the contract for construction.

Operations and Projects Coordinator Mike Northan said this work will improve ADA compliance, vehicle barriers for security and a flagpole. This was budgeted in the Capital Improvement Plan and the contract underwent review from the District Attorney's Office.

Comptroller Jennifer McCain said this was budgeted for \$15,000 and the balance will be absorbed into the Justice Court's Special Revenue Fund.

Public Comment: None

Motion: I, Commissioner Mitchell, move to accept the quote from Coons Construction for site improvements at 800 South C Street to provide sidewalk widening for ADA compliance, bollards for building protection, and a flagpole in an amount not to exceed \$21,478.00 and to authorize the County Manager to sign the contract for construction. **Seconded by:** Donald Gilman. **Vote:** Motion passed unanimously.

34. DISCUSSION/FOR POSSIBLE ACTION: Update, discussion, and provide direction to county staff and lobbyists regarding upcoming bills and legislation affecting Storey County including, but not limited to, the following: SB69 Storey County bill adjusting tax abatement programming, SB78 amending regulations related to the Comstock Historic District Commission; AB77 tax abatements; BDR S-404 V&T Railway, AB14 voter registration of candidates; AB70 energy; AB96 master plans contents; AB64 open meeting law; AB66 addition of district judges; proposals relating to the number of required planning commissioners; and other bills and BDRs potentially affecting Storey County.

County Manager Austin Osborne said there is no new news on these, but it is a standing item.

- SB69 does have a hearing scheduled for Feb. 13 before Revenue and Finance and Storey County will give a presentation. Commissioner Mitchell said meetings have been set up.
- Mr. Osborne said SB78, the Comstock Historic District bill, will not apply to the CHD. We don't have that in writing, so we are still following and discussing possible County control with state and other counties. Commissioner Mitchell wants to oppose SB78, because if there is one thing you want to change, it is seen as opposition, so he wants it on the record.
- Mr. Osborne said the legislative team is monitoring conversations regarding NDOT, but are getting hints of revenue-sharing. This is not currently in any bill being considered.
- AB77 deals with abatements. Commissioner Gilman said he dislikes one element of the bill that gives GOED final approval of applications. Mr. Osborne is taking note of this as part of direction from the board. Mr. Osborne said if a bill came that would block a company from coming to Storey County that we would oppose it, and the commissioners agreed.

• For the last 12 years, we have worked with Quad Counties; Lyon, Douglas, Storey and Carson City, but to maintain coordinated communications with these counties, as we all have similar issues.

Commissioner Mitchell noted the V&T bill was AB32 by Carson City: we supported the bill draft request. He said some bills will impact judicial positions, as Carson City will now add another judge. Clerk & Treasurer Jim Hindle said he has had several meetings, and it will financially impact Storey County. Mr. Osborne said a new District Court in the County would cost \$50 million. The jail program is just a jail and some offices. Part of the building facilities' assessments is to build a new District Court, or if the Courthouse is used for only the first district court.

Commissioner Mitchell asked to line-item the NACO bills at the next meeting. Mr. Osborne said yes, and that all our elected officials are monitoring their own bills as well.

Public Comment: None

Motion: I, Commissioner Mitchell, move to direct staff and lobbyists to represent Storey County on known BDRs, bills, and other potential legislation affecting Storey County as follows: to take the discussion and notes from that discussion on the record today and implement it. **Seconded by:** Donald Gilman. **Vote:** Motion passed unanimously.







SUBJECT: DISCIPLINARY ACTIONS AND APPEALS

POLICY: Storey County takes seriously all complaints of misconduct under its policies. Storey County will accept and address all complaints of misconduct in accordance with this policy. It is also the policy of the county to ensure that complaints of misconduct can be reported without concern for reprisal or retaliation.

1.1 Purpose

This policy provides guidelines for noticing potential discipline, providing due process, disciplining, and providing for appeals of discipline in a justified and fair manner. Investigations of alleged misconduct will conform to Policy 1000 Investigations of Alleged Misconduct. This policy does not apply to elected officials, department heads, the County Manager, or any other employee deemed at-will, and it is not intended to create due process rights for those specific individuals. Department heads and the County Manager are at-will employees, and nothing in this policy is intended to create due process rights for those individuals.

1.2 Justification for Discipline

Disciplinary action, up to and including termination, may be taken against an employee for unsatisfactory performance or for misconduct including, but not limited to, the following:

- a. Conduct unbecoming an employee in the employer's service, or discourteous treatment of members of the public or a fellow employee, or any other act of omission or commission that impacts negatively on the public's perception of the integrity or credibility of the employer or erodes the public confidence in the employer.
- b. Falsification of or making a material omission on forms, records, or reports including applications, timecards, and other employer records.
- c. Absence from work without permission or without notification to an appropriate supervisor or manager, habitual absence or tardiness, or misuse of sick leave.
- d. Unauthorized possession, removal, or use of the employer's property including, but not limited to, funds, records, keys, confidential information of any kind, equipment, supplies, or any other materials.
- e. Disseminating confidential information to unauthorized persons within and outside the workplace.
- f. Insubordination, refusing to follow directions, or other disrespectful conduct directed toward a supervisor or manager.

- g. Sexual harassment or other prohibited behavior directed toward another employee, member of the public, vendor, or anyone doing business with the employer, or anyone present on premises owned or controlled by the employer.
- h. Actual or threatened physical violence including, but not limited to, intimidation, overt or subtle threats, harassment, stalking, or any form of coercion, except as may be required of a peace officer in the course of his/her duties.
- i. Possession or inappropriate use of drugs or alcohol on property owned or controlled by the employer or while on duty or during an on-call status.
- j. Possession, bringing, or aiding others in bringing unauthorized firearms, weapons, hazardous biological material or chemicals, or other dangerous substances onto property owned or controlled by the employer.
- k. Violation of safety or health policies or practices or engaging in conduct that creates a safety or health hazard to other employees, the public, vendors, or him/herself.
- 1. Dishonesty, including intentionally or negligently providing false information, intentionally falsifying records, employment applications, or other documents.
- m. Willfully or intentionally violating or failing to comply with the employer's policies, rules, regulations, and/or procedures.
- n. Unsatisfactory work performance.
- o. Failure to demonstrate professionalism, courtesy, tact, and discretion in all interactions with coworkers, supervisors, and the public; use common sense discretion; remain safe, socially moral, lawful, affective, adaptive, and efficient.

1.3 Forms of Disciplinary Action

- a. Disciplinary action includes, but is not limited to, one or more of the following:
 - i. Verbal warning (document time, date, and subject)
 - ii. Written reprimand
 - iii. Suspension
 - iv. Pay reduction
 - v. Demotion
 - vi. Termination (Reference: Section D Public Hearing for Dismissed Employees of Counties, Cities and Incorporated Towns and Unincorporated Towns)
- b. A department head or the County Manager who is intending to impose disciplinary action of the above items 1.3(a)(iii-vi) shall first consult with the Administrative Officer and/or Personnel Director before any action is taken in order to ensure that all policies and procedures have been followed correctly.
- c. Employees' signed copies of the above items section 1.3(a)(i-vi) must be placed in employees master personnel file, and a copy provided to employees. The discipline will remain in the employee's master personnel file for the following durations or otherwise if specified in a collective bargaining agreement, and in accordance with records retention statutes. When the discipline is eligible to be removed from the master personnel file, the employee may submit a request in writing to the Human Resources office for the file to

be removed from that file. The Human Resources office will have 30 days from receipt of the request to remove the discipline subject to removal.

- i. Verbal warning 12 months;
- ii. Written reprimand 18 months;
- iii. Suspension 24 months;
- iv. Pay reduction permanent;
- v. Demotion permanent;
- vi. Termination permanent.
- d. FLSA Exempt employees are subject to the following rules regarding disciplinary pay deductions and unpaid suspensions:
 - i. Pay deductions may only be made in cases of violations of safety rules of major significance, including those rules related to the prevention of serious danger in the workplace or to other employees. An example would be violating a rule that prohibits smoking around flammable material. Deductions can be made in any amount.
 - ii. Unpaid suspensions may be imposed for infractions of workplace conduct rules, such as rules prohibiting sexual harassment, workplace violence, drug or alcohol use, or for violating state or federal laws. The suspension must be for serious misconduct, not for performance issues. Suspensions must be in fullday increments.
 - iii. Suspensions for performance issues must be made in full-week increments.

1.4 Investigation

An investigation of any employee may be conducted in response to a complaint or allegation that the employee engaged in activity or behavior that violated county administrative policies. The investigation will be performed in accordance with Policy 1000 Investigations of Alleged Misconduct. The investigation of law enforcement personnel will also conform to NRS 289.

1.5 Due Process

The employee may utilize due process provided for in this policy or s/he may utilize due process, such as the grievance process, set forth in the applicable collective bargaining agreement, but the employee may not utilize both processes.

Unless designated otherwise in a contract or collective bargaining agreement, prior to taking disciplinary action involving suspension reduction in pay, demotion, or termination against an employee, the employer will take action intended to ensure that the employee is afforded due process. Due process in regard to employment-related disciplinary action includes, among other actions, making certain the employee is provided notice of the reason for the disciplinary action and is given the opportunity to provide a response to the proposed disciplinary action prior to an appropriate supervisor making a final decision regarding the disciplinary action.

A. Notice of Intent to Discipline

Unless designated otherwise in a contract or collective bargaining agreement, in In situations where the proposed disciplinary action involves a suspension, a reduction in pay, a demotion, and/or termination, written notice of the proposed disciplinary action will be hand-delivered or sent certified mail to the employee. The notice will include the following information:

- 1. The nature of the disciplinary action proposed;
- 2. The effective date of the proposed disciplinary action;
- 3. A statement of the proposed disciplinary action with documentation, statements, and/or other evidence supporting the proposed disciplinary action;
- 4. A statement advising the employee of his/her right to file a written response, or to submit a written request for a pre-disciplinary conference with the Personnel Director and/or Administrative Officer within 5 work days of receipt of the notice of proposed disciplinary action; and
- 5. A statement that the employee's failure to file a written response or request a predisciplinary conference in a timely manner, or to appear at the pre-disciplinary conference after requesting such, will constitute a forfeiture of the employee's rights to any further appeal. (Reference: Section 1.6 Public Hearing for Dismissed Employees Pursuant to NRS)

B. Employee Review of Allegation and Evidence

If the regular employee requests, s/he will be given the opportunity, as soon as practical, to review the documents or other evidence, if any (except for attorney-client privileged documents), on which the proposed disciplinary action is based.

The Administrative Officer and/or Personnel Director will restrict the employee to "incamera" (in chambers) review only, in which s/he may review the documents under close supervision of the Administrative Officer and/or Personnel Director, or his/her designee, will be allowed to take notes, but will not be allowed to photocopy, photograph, video, record, duplicate, or otherwise keep the documents or materials. The employee may have up to two representative present during the review and the representative(s) may review the documents with the employee, as allowed by the employee, under the same restrictions.

C. Pre-Disciplinary Conference

When the employee requests a conference after receipt of the proposed disciplinary action, but prior to any disciplinary action being imposed, the Administrative Officer and/or Personnel Director will schedule a meeting with the employee and his/her representative(s) (if the employee requests a representative(s) be present) and the department head in a timely manner to review the reason for and basis of the proposed disciplinary action. At this conference, the department head, and the Administrative Officer and/or Personnel Director will also provide the employee with an opportunity to present relevant information which may impact the nature or severity of the proposed disciplinary action.

The pre-disciplinary process is intended to provide the employee opportunity to present to the department head, and the Administrative Officer and/or Personnel Director a written or

oral response after having the opportunity to review the supporting materials and prior to imposed discipline. The employee must consider the following:

- 1. The response is not intended to be an adversarial or formal hearing;
- 2. Although the employee may be represented by one or more uninvolved representative and/or by legal counsel, the response is not intended to accommodate the presentation of testimony or witnesses;
- 3. The employee may suggest that further investigation could be conducted or the employee may offer any additional information or mitigating factors for the department head and the Administrative Officer and/or Personnel Director to consider;
- 4. In the event that the Administrative Officer and/or Personnel Director decides to cause further investigation, the employee will be provided with a summary of the investigation results prior to imposed discipline;
- 5. The employee may, thereafter, have the opportunity to further respond orally or in writing to the department head and the Administrative Officer and/or Personnel Director on the limited issues of information raised in any subsequent materials.

D. Implementation of Discipline

No later than 5 work days from receipt of the employee's written response or conclusion of the pre-disciplinary conference, the department head, after consultation with the Administrative Officer and/or Personnel Director, will issue a written decision to the affected employee. The written decision will inform the employee that:

- 1. The proposed disciplinary action will be implemented; or
- 2. The proposed disciplinary action will be modified, with an explanation; or
- 3. The proposed disciplinary action will be rescinded, with explanation; or
- 4. That additional time is needed for the employer to review new evidence and/or to interview additional witnesses brought forth by the employee during the predisciplinary conference [see section (C) Pre-Disciplinary Conference].

Nothing in this policy, regardless of whether discipline is or is not administered, shall preclude or prevent the department head or the Administrative Officer and/or Personnel Director from requiring the subject employee to undergo additional training and professional development, participate in an Employee Assistance Program (EAP) to address job-related matters and consistence with business necessity, or undergo follow-up or ongoing consultation with the Human Resources office or other employee improvement program that is intended to correct and improve employee behavior or performance.

Disciplinary action for law enforcement personnel will also conform to NRS 289.

E. Resignation or Retirement Prior to Discipline

In the event that the accused employee tenders a written resignation or notice of retirement prior to the imposition of discipline, the situation shall be noted in the file, except as may be limited by NRS 289 for law enforcement personnel. The tender of a resignation or retirement by itself will not serve as the grounds for the termination of any pending investigation or discipline.

F. Appeal

1. Unless the employee utilizes the appeal process set forth in a contract or the applicable collective bargaining agreement, the affected employee may appeal the disciplinary action to the County Manager by filing a written appeal with the Administrative Officer and/or Personnel Director within 5 work days of the effective date of the disciplinary action.

In the event that a conflict of interest exists with the County Manager in the case involving discipline, the Administrative Officer and/or Personnel Director will seek a qualified County Manager or City Manager from a jurisdiction outside of Storey County, preferably a county with reasonably similar staff numbers and other organizational characteristics to Storey County, located in the State of Nevada, to serve as the appellate.

- 2. The written appeal must state the basis of the appeal and contain a specific admission or denial of each of the material statements in the decision. If an employee fails to file a written appeal conforming to these requirements within 5 work days as shown in subsection (1) above, s/he is deemed to have waived the right to appeal. (Reference: Section 1.6 Public Hearing for Dismissed Employees Pursuant to NRS.)
- 3. After the employee has submitted a timely appeal to the Administrative Officer and/or Personnel Director, the Administrative Officer and/or Personnel Director will set a date for a disciplinary appeal hearing. At such hearing, the employee will have the right to be represented by an attorney or other representative retained by the employee, to present evidence and argument in response to the disciplinary action, and to question and cross-examine adverse witnesses. The hearing may be conducted informally without conforming to the formal rules of evidence and such informality of the hearing process shall not invalidate the decision rendered. The County Manager will issue to the parties a decision within 5 work days following such hearing. The decision of the County Manager is final.

1.6 Public Hearing for Dismissed Employees Pursuant to NRS

In accordance with NRS 245.065, when an employee of a county, other than a department head or the County Manager, who has been employed by the county for 12 or more months is dismissed from employment, the employee may request within 15 days of the date of dismissal a written statement specifically setting forth the reasons for the dismissal. Within 15 days of the date of the request the employee so dismissed shall be furnished the written statement. Within 30 days after receipt of the written statement, the dismissed employee may, in writing, request a public hearing before the board of county commissioners to determine the reasonableness of the action. The board of county commissioners shall grant the dismissed employee a public hearing within 15 days after receipt of the written request. At the public hearing, technical rules of evidence do not apply. Such dismissed employee is not required to utilize the established predisciplinary conference and appeal process in this policy before requesting a public hearing.

1.7 Administrative Leave During Disciplinary Proceeding

By notifying the employee in writing, the Administrative Officer and/or Personnel Director may place an employee (including department heads and the County Manager) on administrative leave, with or without pay pending an investigation of alleged misconduct or performance deficiencies, prior to or during a disciplinary proceeding, or during the review of the employee's response to a proposed disciplinary action. The notice of administrative leave will include a statement that the leave is not a disciplinary action. An employee placed on administrative leave without pay who is later reinstated without disciplinary action being imposed will be reimbursed for any pay and benefits lost during the administrative leave.

1.8 False Accusations

An employee who has been found to have intentionally filed a false report of wrongdoing may be subject to discipline up to and including termination.

RESPONSIBILITY FOR REVIEW: The County Personnel Director and/or Administrative Officer will review this policy every 5 years or sooner as necessary.

SUBJECT: DISCIPLINARY ACTIONS AND APPEALS

POLICY: Storey County takes seriously all complaints of misconduct under its policies. Storey County will accept and address all complaints of misconduct in accordance with this policy. It is also the policy of the county to ensure that complaints of misconduct can be reported without concern for reprisal or retaliation.

1.1 Purpose

This policy provides guidelines for noticing potential discipline, providing due process, disciplining, and providing for appeals of discipline in a justified and fair manner. Investigations of alleged misconduct will conform to Policy 1000 Investigations of Alleged Misconduct. This policy, except Sections 1.2 and 1.3 does not apply to elected officials, department heads, or the County Manager, or any other employee deemed at-will, and it is not intended to create due process rights for those specific individuals. Department heads and the County Manager are at-will employees, and nothing in this policy is intended to create due process rights for those individuals.

1.2 Justification for Discipline

Disciplinary action, up to and including termination, may be taken against an employee for unsatisfactory performance or for misconduct including, but not limited to, the following:

- a. Conduct unbecoming an employee in the employer's service, or discourteous treatment of members of the public or a fellow employee, or any other act of omission or commission that impacts negatively on the public's perception of the integrity or credibility of the employer or erodes the public confidence in the employer.
- b. Falsification of or making a material omission on forms, records, or reports including applications, time cards, and other employer records.
- c. Absence from work without permission or without notification to an appropriate supervisor or manager, habitual absence or tardiness, or misuse of sick leave.
- d. Unauthorized possession, removal, or use of the employer's property including, but not limited to, funds, records, keys, confidential information of any kind, equipment, supplies, or any other materials.
- e. Disseminating confidential information to unauthorized persons within and outside the workplace.
- f. Insubordination, refusing to follow directions, or other disrespectful conduct directed toward a supervisor or manager.

- g. Sexual harassment or other prohibited behavior directed toward another employee, member of the public, vendor, or anyone doing business with the employer, or anyone present on premises owned or controlled by the employer.
- h. Actual or threatened physical violence including, but not limited to, intimidation, overt or subtle threats, harassment, stalking, or any form of coercion, except as may be required of a peace officer in the course of his/her duties.
- i. Possession or inappropriate use of drugs or alcohol on property owned or controlled by the employer or while on duty or during an on-call status.
- j. Possession, bringing, or aiding others in bringing unauthorized firearms, weapons, hazardous biological material or chemicals, or other dangerous substances onto property owned or controlled by the employer.
- k. Violation of safety or health policies or practices, or engaging in conduct that creates a safety or health hazard to other employees, the public, vendors, or him/herself.
- 1. Dishonesty, including intentionally or negligently providing false information, intentionally falsifying records, employment applications, or other documents.
- m. Willfully or intentionally violating or failing to comply with the employer's policies, rules, regulations, and/or procedures.
- n. Unsatisfactory work performance.
- o. Failure to demonstrate professionalism, courtesy, tact, and discretion in all interactions with coworkers, supervisors, and the public; use common sense discretion; remain safe, socially moral, lawful, affective, adaptive, and efficient.





Storey County has commenced the process of identifying existing public access roadways located on public land. Nevada Revised Statues Section 405.191 identifies what is considered a public road. Storey County is following this definition to designate roadways that meet the following:

Any way which exists upon a right-of-way granted by Congress over public lands of the United States not reserved for public uses in chapter 262, section 8, 14 Statutes 253 (former 43 U.S.C. § 932, commonly referred to as R.S. 2477), and accepted by general public use and enjoyment before, on or after July 1, 1979. Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, each board of county commissioners may locate and determine the width of such rights-of-way and locate, open for public use and establish thereon county roads or highways, but public use alone has been and is sufficient to evidence an acceptance of the grant of a public user right-of-way pursuant to former 43 U.S.C. § 932. In a county in which a board of county highway commissioners has exclusive control of all matters relating to the construction, repairing and maintaining of public highways, roads and bridges within the county pursuant to <u>NRS 403.090</u>, the board of county highway commissioners may locate and determine the width of those rights-of-way and open those rights-of-way for public use for the purpose of designating county roads pursuant to <u>NRS 403.170</u> or taking any other action

concerning those rights-of-way pursuant to chapter 403 of NRS.

Storey County entered into a contract with Mr. Jerry Elkins to do the research on various roadway sections located within Storey County that had not previously been researched by Storey County or identified as a county-recognized road. Utilizing this research, Storey County is recognizing each roadway segment that meets the NRS Section 405.191 definition on public property. The research, map, legal description and photographs are included for each roadway segment and a Resolution recognizing the roadway segment by the Storey County Board of Highway Commissioners is generated for each segment.

Upon recordation of the Resolution, each segment of roadway will be added to the overall Storey County map of county roads and designated as a minor county road. The map will then be presented to the State of Nevada Department of Transportation as identified in NRS Section 403.190.

It should be noted that NRS 403.170(1)(c) states that county roads designated as minor county roads do not have to be maintained and it further provides that the state and county are immune from liability for damages suffered by anyone using a minor county road. The statute also does not require signage to create the immunity from liability.

County staff are proceeding with recognizing the roadways that are located on publicly owned land only. Some of the research does include other roadway areas, including areas privately owned. If the need arises in the future, this research is anticipated to be utilized in the legal process of identifying public access across private property.

The applicable NRS sections identified in this report are attached as exhibits to this staff report.

Unnamed, Storey County Road Number 910100

This roadway is located north of Six Mile Canyon Road and south of the Virginia Ranches 40-acre subdivision. The roadway segment is location on APNs 004-301-16 which is managed by the Bureau of Land Management and on a privately owned parcel, APN 004-281-80. The Resolution 25-757 establishing the segment as a minor county road excludes the portion of the segment on private property. The road is approximately 3,741 feet in length and approximately 8-feet wide. The effect of identifying the road as a minor county road is to identify it as a public road, available for public use but that it is not maintained by Storey County. It must be used by motorists at their own risk.

Attached to this staff report is a legal description of the Unnamed Storey County Road Number 910100, which includes maps and photographs of the roadway. A Resolution establishing the roadway on public land as a minor public road is also attached for consideration for adoption. Staff is recommending approval of the proposed Resolution.

Road Collections that don't overlay the track on the Proof Map


It frequently happens that the course of a road is altered by a washout, foreign obstacle (such as a fallen tree or rock), severe rutting or erosion. In cases like this, via the concept of 'maintenance by use', a go around from the original provable course is established. This is generally a short detour.

Occasionally, a road will start in the same close proximity, perhaps follow the provable track for a distance, and then divert substantially from the provable course. And then end up at the same approximate location served by the provable road.

In cases like this the provable track is no longer in use. But again the concept of 'maintenance by use' clearly evidences that the new track is not a new road. It is in effect the same road merely located via a more passable track serving the same destination.

These roads have been processed in the same manner as all other RS2477 qualifying roads. The only recognizable distinction is that the proof map clearly shows that there is no pre 1976 track underlying the collection. But it does show the starting and ending locations evidencing that it does serve the destination of the now unused original track.

This document is included in the Road Folders of these roads. There is also a comprehensive list of such roads by Road # maintained in the Project file.

Background & Analysis	

Storey County has commenced the process of identifying existing public access roadways located on public land. Nevada Revised Statues Section 405.191 identifies what is considered a public road. Storey County is following this definition to designate roadways that meet the following:

Any way which exists upon a right-of-way granted by Congress over public lands of the United States not reserved for public uses in chapter 262, section 8, 14 Statutes 253 (former 43 U.S.C. § 932, commonly referred to as R.S. 2477), and accepted by general public use and enjoyment before, on or after July 1, 1979. Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, each board of county commissioners may locate and determine the width of such rights-of-way and locate, open for public use and establish thereon county roads or highways, but public use alone has been and is sufficient to evidence an acceptance of the grant of a public user right-of-way pursuant to former 43 U.S.C. § 932. In a county in which a board of county highway commissioners has exclusive control of all matters relating to the construction, repairing and maintaining of public highways, roads and bridges within the county pursuant to <u>NRS 403.090</u>, the board of county highway commissioners may locate and determine the width of those rights-of-way and open those rights-of-way for public use for the purpose of designating county roads pursuant to <u>NRS 403.170</u> or taking any other action

concerning those rights-of-way pursuant to chapter 403 of NRS.

Storey County entered into a contract with Mr. Jerry Elkins to do the research on various roadway sections located within Storey County that had not previously been researched by Storey County or identified as a county-recognized road. Utilizing this research, Storey County is recognizing each roadway segment that meets the NRS Section 405.191 definition on public property. The research, map, legal description and photographs are included for each roadway segment and a Resolution recognizing the roadway segment by the Storey County Board of Highway Commissioners is generated for each segment.

Upon recordation of the Resolution, each segment of roadway will be added to the overall Storey County map of county roads and designated as a minor county road. The map will then be presented to the State of Nevada Department of Transportation as identified in NRS Section 403.190.

It should be noted that NRS 403.170(1)(c) states that county roads designated as minor county roads do not have to be maintained and it further provides that the state and county are immune from liability for damages suffered by anyone using a minor county road. The statute also does not require signage to create the immunity from liability.


County staff are proceeding with recognizing the roadways that are located on publicly owned land only. Some of the research does include other roadway areas, including areas privately owned. If the need arises in the future, this research is anticipated to be utilized in the legal process of identifying public access across private property.

The applicable NRS sections identified in this report are attached as exhibits to this staff report.

In a county in which a board of county highway commissioners has exclusive control of all matters relating to the construction, repairing and maintaining of public highways, roads and bridges within the county pursuant to <u>NRS 403.090</u>, the board of county highway commissioners may locate and determine the width of those rights-of-way and open those rights-of-way for public use for the purpose of designating county roads pursuant to <u>NRS 403.170</u> or taking any other action

concerning those rights-of-way pursuant to chapter 403 of NRS.

Storey County entered into a contract with Mr. Jerry Elkins to do the research on various roadway sections located within Storey County that had not previously been researched by Storey County or identified as a county-recognized road. Utilizing this research, Storey County is recognizing each roadway segment that meets the NRS Section 405.191 definition on public property. The research, map, legal description and photographs are included for each roadway segment and a Resolution recognizing the roadway segment by the Storey County Board of Highway Commissioners is generated for each segment.

Upon recordation of the Resolution, each segment of roadway will be added to the overall Storey County map of county roads and designated as a minor county road. The map will then be presented to the State of Nevada Department of Transportation as identified in NRS Section 403.190.

It should be noted that NRS 403.170(1)(c) states that county roads designated as minor county roads do not have to be maintained and it further provides that the state and county are immune from liability for damages suffered by anyone using a minor county road. The statute also does not require signage to create the immunity from liability.


County staff are proceeding with recognizing the roadways that are located on publicly owned land only. Some of the research does include other roadway areas, including areas privately owned. If the need arises in the future, this research is anticipated to be utilized in the legal process of identifying public access across private property.

The applicable NRS sections identified in this report are attached as exhibits to this staff report.

Location:	The road is located east of Geiger Grade Road (Highway 341) between the Virginia City townsite and the Virginia Ranches 40 acre subdivision. The portion of the roadway segment proposed to be established is located on APN 004-301-07 on land managed by the Bureau of Land Management. The overall roadway segment is approximately 3,233 linear feet in length and has an approximate width of 14-feet.		
Background & Analysis			

Storey County has commenced the process of identifying existing public access roadways located on public land. Nevada Revised Statues Section 405.191 identifies what is considered a public road. Storey County is following this definition to designate roadways that meet the following:

Any way which exists upon a right-of-way granted by Congress over public lands of the United States not reserved for public uses in chapter 262, section 8, 14 Statutes 253 (former 43 U.S.C. § 932, commonly referred to as R.S. 2477), and accepted by general public use and enjoyment before, on or after July 1, 1979. Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, each board of county commissioners may locate and determine the width of such rights-of-way and locate, open for public use and establish thereon county roads or highways, but public use alone has been and is sufficient to evidence an acceptance of the grant of a public user right-of-way pursuant to former 43 U.S.C. § 932. In a county in which a board of county highway commissioners has exclusive control of all matters relating to the construction, repairing and maintaining of public highways, roads and bridges within the county pursuant to <u>NRS 403.090</u>, the board of county highway commissioners may locate and determine the width of those rights-of-way and open those rights-of-way for public

use for the purpose of designating county roads pursuant to <u>NRS 403.170</u> or taking any other action concerning those rights-of-way pursuant to <u>chapter 403</u> of NRS.

Storey County entered into a contract with Mr. Jerry Elkins to do the research on various roadway sections located within Storey County that had not previously been researched by Storey County or identified as a county-recognized road. Utilizing this research, Storey County is recognizing each roadway segment that meets the NRS Section 405.191 definition on public property. The research, map, legal description and photographs are included for each roadway segment and a Resolution recognizing the roadway segment by the Storey County Board of Highway Commissioners is generated for each segment.

Upon recordation of the Resolution, each segment of roadway will be added to the overall Storey County map of county roads and designated as a minor county road. The map will then be presented to the State of Nevada Department of Transportation as identified in NRS Section 403.190.

It should be noted that NRS 403.170(1)(c) states that county roads designated as minor county roads do not have to be maintained and it further provides that the state and county are immune from liability for damages suffered by anyone using a minor county road. The statute also does not require signage to create the immunity from liability.

County staff are proceeding with recognizing the roadways that are located on publicly owned land only. Some of the research does include other roadway areas, including areas privately owned. If the need arises in the future, this research is anticipated to be utilized in the legal process of identifying public access across private property.


The applicable NRS sections identified in this report are attached as exhibits to this staff report.

Hillside, Storey County Road Number 920020

This roadway is located east of Geiger Grade Road (Highway 341) and north of the Virginia City cemetery site. The roadway segment is location on APNs 004-301-16 which is managed by the Bureau of Land Management. The overall road segment is approximately 3,233 feet in length and approximately 14-feet wide. The effect of identifying the road as a minor county road is to identify it as a public road, available for public use but that it is not maintained by Storey County. It must be used by motorists at their own risk.

The overall roadway segment is located on both public and private land. The area on private land is not being established as a minor county road at this time. The proposed Resolution excludes land located on private property.

Attached to this staff report is a legal description of Hillside, Storey County Road Number 920020, which includes maps and photographs of the roadway. A Resolution establishing the roadway on public land as a minor public road is also attached for consideration for adoption. Staff is recommending approval of the proposed Resolution.



The yellow line indicates approximate location of the roadway segment on public land. The green line and the yellow line together are the approximate total length of the roadway segment. The line depicted in green is on private property and is excluded from establishment per the proposed Resolution.




Locator Map


It frequently happens that the course of a road is altered by a washout, foreign obstacle (such as a fallen tree or rock), severe rutting or erosion. In cases like this, via the concept of 'maintenance by use', a go around from the original provable course is established. This is generally a short detour.

Occasionally, a road will start in the same close proximity, perhaps follow the provable track for a distance, and then divert substantially from the provable course. And then end up at the same approximate location served by the provable road.

In cases like this the provable track is no longer in use. But again the concept of 'maintenance by use' clearly evidences that the new track is not a new road. It is in effect the same road merely located via a more passable track serving the same destination.

These roads have been processed in the same manner as all other RS2477 qualifying roads. The only recognizable distinction is that the proof map clearly shows that there is no pre 1976 track underlying the collection. But it does show the starting and ending locations evidencing that it does serve the destination of the now unused original track.

This document is included in the Road Folders of these roads. There is also a comprehensive list of such roads by Road # maintained in the Project file.

Request:	The applicant requests a Special Use Permit 2025-014 to operate an outdoor establishment. Planning Commission:	The Planning Commission heard this request at their February 20, 2025, meeting. A discussion of the project occurred and the applicant answered questions about potential special events and the vision she has for the use of the property. Staff proposed some small edits to the recommended conditions of approval. Todd Tuttle, VCTC Director, spoke about special events and was supportive of the project. Prior to the meeting, a residential neighbor to the south of the property contacted the Planning Department to express support for the project. The Planning Commission voted to accept the edits to Special Conditions F, N and R, and to strike the words "but not limited to" on Exhibit A under Proposed Event Types and recommended approval of the project with a 6-0 vote (1 absent). The recommended conditions of approval and Exhibit A of this staff report reflect the edits.

1. Background & Analysis


A. <u>Site Location and Characteristics</u>: The property is located at 100 N. E Street in Virginia City, Storey County, Nevada. The property is zoned CR – Commercial Residential and is developed on the northwestern portion of the property with a hotel and associated parking lot. Access to this portion of the development is from E Street. The applicant has proposed to host outdoor special events and uses at the hotel property and on the adjacent land owned by the applicant.

This property is unique to Virginia City as it has plenty of excess parking area beyond that required to service the hotel and the parcel has open space that is relatively level which affords opportunities to utilize this outside area for other uses. Most commercial properties within Virginia City are small in size and have topography that doesn't allow for much outdoor usable space.

At this time, the special use permit is addressing the land associated with APNs 001-152-04, 001-154-03 and 001-151-02 only, depicted below in the yellow outline. The applicant does own other properties to the east of these parcels, but these additional properties will be addressed at a future date. The area to the east previously was used by Storey County as a fairgrounds prior to moving to the new location.

B. <u>**Proposed Uses**</u>: The applicant has provided a list of possible uses that may occur in the outdoor area of the properties. Many of these types of uses are similar to uses that the Virginia City Tourism Commission (VCTC) hosts to assist local businesses with special events to attract tourism to the vicinity. The applicant proposes to develop their own special events to bring visitors to their property and the town in general.

Exhibit A of this staff report has a list of potential special events the property owner may desire to have occur at the site. In coming up with the list, the property owner was brainstorming anything they think might be feasible to include in the special use permit. Many of these uses may not occur regularly or concurrently or maybe not at all, but are listed to give an idea of the types of activities that might be pursued.

It should be noted that this special use permit addresses land uses that will be permissible not the physical development of the special event features. Many of the listed special events may also require building and fire code review and additional permitting may be necessary based on the individual event. For example, a wedding may desire an extremely large tent structure or a concert may desire installation of a stage. Although permissible by the special use permit and temporary in nature, a permit may be required depending on the design and size of the feature. Layout of facilities may also be a concern to the Fire District to make sure all features are accessible in case of an emergency. This special use permit has identified special event uses and the recommended conditions of approval have listed the parameters these uses must conform to be consistent with special use permit. Any additional permitting requirements would occur at the time a special event is proposed.

C. <u>Special Events</u>: The special use permit addresses special events for the property. Special events are temporary and are not a permanent feature for the property. Special events have a beginning date and an end date. In most cases based on the list of events in Exhibit A, the special event may be for a day, a few days or a weekend event. Some uses by the nature of the use may last longer, such as an ice skating rink for the winter months, a pumpkin patch in the fall or a tree lot in December.

There are some uses that have a concern with the timing and "permanence" at the site. Food trucks, camping and retail sales as special events are particularly a concern with the length of stay at the property. These types of uses are permissible when associated with a particular event, but the long term presence at the site requires a different type of permitting. For example, a food truck associated with an event occurring onsite, or during a weekend event, may be appropriate, but the presence of a food truck at the site for the entire summer is a different land use. Camping is similar. Allowing for camping for a specific event may be appropriate, but the presence of camping at any extended length of time evolves into a campground use and different review and needs for the site. As listed in the recommended condition of approvals, the parameters for these types of uses are identified.

D. Zoning Code. The project is located within CR Commercial Residential zoning district of Virginia City. The parcels adjacent to E Street (APN 001-152-04 and 001-151-02) are within the Downtown District of Virginia City and APN 001-154-03 is accessed from F Street and is located outside of the Downtown District. The Chapter 17.30 CR zoning lists seasonal holiday sales and farmers markets as allowed outdoor uses and open-air markets, outdoor venues and display and sale of items outside of a building as a special use. In addition, Chapter 17.12.100 (General Provisions for all zones) Section C states

the following:




Figure 12.9: The diagram shows where merchandise and other items may and may not be displayed. The diagram does not apply to signs and advertising devices which are regulated pursuant to chapter 17.84 Signs and billboards.

C. In zones where a commercial business is allowed, a special use permit is required for the display, sale, barter, or trade of items outside of a permanent building, except for permitted temporary uses and farmer's markets. A business may not display items for sale or conduct any business on the public right-of-way (See Figure 12.9.) or between the public traveled way and building, such as on the boardwalk/sidewalk. Business including dining, customer seating, and other uses, but not the display of merchandise and other items for sale, barter, or trade, may occur in the front, side, and rear yards of the business where such area exists. Recessed door openings and thresholds may be used to display items for sale, barter, or trade and to otherwise conduct business.

The applicant proposes to host a variety of outdoor special events activities. All activities shall take place on private property. Parking spaces associated with the needs for the onsite hotel will be retained onsite so parking for the existing land use will remain during the special event activities. These proposed uses, and similar uses, are consistent and appear appropriate with the Commercial Residential zoning for the zoning district and the Downtown District of Virginia City.

This property is unique to Virginia City in that it is fairly large with a level area. The property is located two blocks east of C Street and is within walking distance for residents and tourists that have no issues with the Virginia City slopes. There are a limited number of parcels where such an outdoor venue could be contemplated. Although the Virginia City Tourism Commission (VCTC) does host some similar type events, many of these special events would be separate from the VCTC programs.

Planning staff is of the opinion this is a positive contribution to the Virginia City area. The applicant is a participant in VCTC sponsored events when appropriate but is also independently proposing events to assist themselves with business development. Reliance on the VCTC, or any group in general, should not be a singular business strategy, and the applicant has developed concepts to implement that will address their business along with providing a benefit to the community at large by attracting tourism to the area.

E. <u>Special Use Permit</u>. A Special Use Permit is required because of the outdoor venue and nature of the proposed operation in the CR zoning. Section 17.03.150 of the Storey County Code identifies the process for Special Use Permits. The applicant and this report follow the requirements outlined in the Code.

2. Use Compatibility and Compliance

A. <u>Compatibility with surrounding uses and zones</u>. The following table documents land uses, zoning classification and master plan designations for the land at and surrounding the proposed project. There are no evident conflicts between the proposed project and Storey County Title 17 Zoning or the 2024 Master Plan. The proposed use is also consistent with the surrounding zoning and master plan designations. The residential neighborhood of Virginia City begins south across Union Street from the project area.

- **B.** <u>General use allowances and restrictions</u>. Storey County Code 17.03.150, Special Use Permit, identifies the administration for the Board and Planning Commission for allowing a special use permit. The approval, approval with conditions, or denial of the Special Use Permit must be based on findings of fact that the proposed use is appropriate or inappropriate in the location. The findings listed below are the minimum to be cited in an approval.
 - (1) Complies with the general purpose, goals, objectives, and standards of the county master plan, this title, and any other plan, program, map, or ordinance adopted, or under consideration pursuant to official notice by the county.

The proposed use will be an outdoor venue which is permitted with a Special Use Permit for the Commercial Residential zone. The proposed business will

include a variety of scheduled special events and outdoor activities along with maintaining the existing hotel on the property. The majority of the outdoor venue will be located within the Downtown District of Virginia City and proposes activities for local residents and tourists which the master plan encourages for a wide range uses within a single community.

(2) The proposal location, size, height, operations, and other significant features will be compatible with and will not cause substantial negative impact on adjacent land uses, or will perform a function or provide a service that is essential to the surrounding land uses, community, and neighborhood.

The proposed activity will be an outdoor venue, located adjacent to commercial and tourist uses and will provide a variety of outdoor activities both for tourists and residents. All activities will occur on private property. No activities will occur within the public right-of-way unless separate authorization from Storey County is acquired for a particular special event. The residential neighborhood begins to the south across Union Street. As a recommended condition of approval, the special use permit will require activities of a special event that generate noise and lighting be located near the center and north of the project area, away from the residential neighborhood to the greatest extent possible.

(3) Will result in no substantial or undue adverse effect on adjacent property, the character of the neighborhood, traffic conditions, parking, public improvements, public sites or right-of-way, or other matters affecting the public health, safety, and general welfare, either as they now exist or as they may in the future be developed as a result of the implementation of the provisions and policies of the county master plan, this title, and any other plans, program, map or ordinance adopted or under consideration pursuant to an official notice, by the county, or other governmental agency having jurisdiction to guide growth and development.

As conditioned, the proposed activities will take place on private property. The majority of the proposed area is located within the Downtown District of Virginia City where commercial and tourist events are meant to take place. The outdoor venue use will compliment the downtown Virginia City and provide activities for both local residents and tourists. The applicant will be required to comply with the Storey County Code associated with noise and lighting for the site along with individual building permits and business licensing, depending on the event.

(4) The proposed use in the proposed area will be adequately served by and will impose no undue burden on any of the improvements, facilities, utilities, or services provided by the county or other governmental agency having jurisdiction in the county.

The proposed use is not expected to require any additional governmental services or impact existing facilities. As conditioned, depending on the needs of the special event, such items including, but not limited to, private security, trash

collection and restroom facilities will be part of the overall operations of the special event and not rely on county services unless such services are negotiated with the county prior to the event.

C. <u>Conformance with the 2024 Storey County Master Plan</u>. The property is located In Virginia City, Storey County, Nevada and is zoned Commercial-Residential and the majority of the property is within the Downtown District. The property is zoned Commercial-Residential

The Storey County Master Plan identifies the following goals:

- Enhance and diversify the local economy by promoting commercial business in Gold Hill, Virginia City, and the Divide that service the specific interests and needs of tourists and local residents.
- Continue to enhance diversification of economic opportunities with the county.
- Design zoning districts to allow for a mix in land use development.

The proposed outdoor special events venue and the property location are consistent with these master plan goals.

3. Findings of Fact

- Motion for approval. The following findings of fact are evident with regard to the requested special use permit when the recommended conditions of approval in Section 4, Recommended Conditions of Approval, are applied.
 - (1) This approval is for Special Use Permit 2025-014 to operate an outdoor establishment. The outdoor venue is associated with the Silverland Inn and will include a variety of scheduled uses and special events. The property is located at 100 N. E Street, Virginia City, Nevada, Assessor's Parcel Number (APN) 001-152-04, 001-154-03 and 001-151-02
 - (2) The proposed project complies with the general purpose, goals, objectives, and standards of the county master plan, this title, and any other plan, program, map, or ordinance adopted, or under consideration pursuant to official notice by the county.
 - (3) As conditioned, the proposal location, size, height, operations, and other significant features will be compatible with and will not cause substantial negative impact on adjacent land uses or will perform a function or provide a service that is essential to the surrounding land uses, community, and neighborhood.
 - (4) As conditioned, the proposed project is not expected to result in no substantial or undue adverse effect on adjacent property, the character of the neighborhood, traffic conditions, parking, public improvements, public sites or right-of-way, or other matters affecting the public health, safety, and general welfare, either as they now exist or as they may in the future be developed as a

result of the implementation of the provisions and policies of the county master plan, this title, and any other plans, program, map or ordinance adopted or under consideration pursuant to an official notice, by the county, or other governmental agency having jurisdiction to guide growth and development.

- (5) The proposed use in the proposed area will be adequately served by and will impose no undue burden on any of the improvements, facilities, utilities, or services provided by the county or other governmental agency having jurisdiction in the county.
- (6) The Special Use Permit conforms to the 2024 Storey County Master Plan for the Virginia City planning area in which the subject property is located. A discussion supporting this finding is provided in Section 2.C of this staff report and the contents thereof are cited in an approval of this Special Use Permit.
- (7) The conditions under the Special Use Permit do not conflict with the minimum requirements in Storey County Code Sections 17.03.150, Special Use Permit and Section 17.30, CR Commercial Residential Zone.
- **B.** <u>Motion for denial</u>. Should a motion be made to deny the Special Use Permit request, the following findings with explanation why should be included in that motion.
 - (1) This denial is for Special Use Permit 2025-014 to operate an outdoor establishment. The outdoor venue is associated with the Silverland Inn and will include a variety of scheduled uses and special events. The property is located at 100 N. E Street, Virginia City, Nevada, Assessor's Parcel Number (APN) 001-152-04, 001-154-03 and 001-151-02.
 - (2) The conditions under the Special Use Permit conflict with the minimum requirements in Storey County Code Sections 17.03.150, Special Use Permit and Section 17.30, CR Commercial Residential Zone.
 - (3) The conditions under the Special Use Permit do not adequately mitigate potential adverse impacts on surrounding uses or protect against potential safety hazards for surrounding use.

4. Recommended Conditions of Approval

- A. **Special Use Permit** Special Use Permit 2025-014 is to operate an outdoor establishment. The outdoor venue is associated with the Silverland Inn and will include a variety of scheduled uses and special events. The property is located at 100 N. E Street, Virginia City, Nevada, Assessor's Parcel Number (APN) 001-152-04, 001-154-03 and 001-151-02.
- Business Operations. This special use permit authorizes the use of an outdoor venue for scheduled activities such as farmer's markets, craft fairs, music and dancing, wedding events and other similar activities as listed in Exhibit A of this staff report. These items are identified as a temporary event and shall operate as such. All special

events shall have a starting and ending date. Parking for the existing hotel use shall remain onsite and available during any special event.

- C. Requirements. The Applicant shall apply for all required permits and licenses, including any applicable building and fire permits, for the project within 24 months from the date of final approval of this SUP, and continuously maintain the validity of those permits/licenses, or this approval shall be null and void. This Special Use Permit shall remain valid as long as the Applicant remains in compliance with the terms of this Special Use Permit and Storey County, State of Nevada, and federal regulations. No activity shall commence prior to the Applicant securing rights to the Special Use Permit.
- **D**. **Compliance**. The use on the subject property must comply with federal, state, and county codes and regulations and the submitted plans and reports, as approved.
- **E. Special Event Site Layout Fire District**. The proposed layout of outdoor temporary structures and parking shall be reviewed by the Storey County Fire Protection District to ensure access for emergency situations complies with the needs of the Fire District.
- F. Special Event Site Layout Placement. Special events which generate noise and excessive lighting requirements shall be located to the greatest extent possible away from the residential structures across Union Street to the south of the project area. A minimum 100-foot setback from Union Street is required for any facilities that generate noise.
- **G. Indemnification/Insurance.** The Applicant warrants that the use of land will conform to the requirements of Storey County, State of Nevada, and applicable federal regulatory and legal requirements; further, the Applicant warrants that continued and future use of the land shall so conform. The Applicant and Property Owner agree to hold Storey County, its officers, and representatives harmless from the costs associated with any damage or liability, and any/all other claims now existing or which may occur as a result of this Special Use Permit.
- **H. Transfer of Rights.** This Special Use Permit (SUP 2025-014) is non-transferable. This Special Use Permit applies to the Applicant's business listed in this permit.
- I. Operation Location. The business shall operate on private property only. No business, or solicitation of business, shall be located or conducted in the public right-of-way unless prior approval from Storey County is obtained.
- J. Noise Restrictions. All noise generated at the site shall be in conformance with Chapter 8.04, Noise Control, of the Storey County Code. Noise-generating activities shall operate only between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 10:00 p.m.
- K. Lighting. All exterior lighting shall be in compliance with Chapter 8.02 Outdoor Lighting, of the Storey County Code. Any proposed lighting (temporary for the event or permanently installed) shall be directed downward and shielded from projecting outside of the project area.

- L. Signs. All signs shall be consistent with Chapter 17.84 of the Storey County Zoning Ordinance.
- **M. Permits**. A separate permit(s) is required for any construction on the property. All construction and proposed development shall be in compliance with the adopted Storey County building and fire codes.
- N. Camping, Food Trucks, Food and Retail Sales. All camping, food trucks and food and retail sales shall be temporary in use and be associated with a special event activity and shall not operate on the site for a length of stay beyond the associated special event activity. Operation of a food truck, food and retail sales and camping (RV, trailer or tent) on the site without being associated with an actively occurring special event is not permitted with this approval.
- **O. Business Licensing.** All business operations on the site, including special events, shall comply with Storey County business licensing requirements.
- **P. Trash.** Removal of trash generated onsite, and any overflow trash that may make its way to the immediately adjacent public rights of way, is the responsibility of the applicant/special event to clean up and remove to the appropriate facility.
- **Q. Security.** Any security necessitated by a special event shall be the responsibility of the applicant/special event.
- **R. Restroom facilities.** Restroom facilities for a special event shall be provided by the applicant/special event in accordance with the standards of the Portable Sanitation Association International.
- **S. Fire Protection District.** All events involving onsite cooking or open flame will be subject to inspection by the Fire District to ensure compliance with all applicable fire and life safety codes. Event organizers must coordinate with the Fire District in advance to facilitate this process.
- **T. Exhibit A.** This permit shall follow the submitted uses and description of operations as indicated in Exhibit A of this staff report.

5. Public Comment

The Planning Department received a phone message from an adjacent property owner south of the proposed project in support of the project. Todd Tuttle, VCTC Director, with a few questions answered, offered support for the project at the Planning Commission meeting. No other public comment was provided.

6. Power of the Board

At the conclusion of the hearing, the Board of County Commissioners must take such action thereon as it deems warranted under the circumstances and announce and record its action by formal resolution, and such resolution must recite the findings of the Board of County Commissioners upon which it bases its decision.

7. Proposed Motions

This section contains two motions from which to choose. The motion for approval is recommended by the Planning Commission and staff in accordance with the findings under Section 3.A of this report. Those findings should be made part of the approval motion. A motion for denial may be made and that motion should cite one or more of the findings shown in Section 3.B. Other findings of fact determined appropriate by the Board of County Commissioners should be made part of either motion.

A. Recommended motion for approval

In accordance with the recommendation by staff, the findings of fact under Section 3.A of this report and as read into the record by county staff and other findings deemed appropriate by the Board of County Commissioners, and in compliance with the conditions of approval, I (*commissioner*), recommend approval of Special Use Permit 2025-014 to operate an outdoor establishment. The outdoor venue is associated with the Silverland Inn and will include a variety of scheduled uses and special events. The property is located at 100 N. E Street, Virginia City, Nevada, Assessor's Parcel Number (APN) 001-152-04, 001-154-03 and 001-151-02.

B. Alternative motion for denial

Against the recommendation by staff, but in accordance with the findings of fact under Section 3.2 of this report and read into the record by county staff and other findings deemed appropriate by the Board of County Commissioners, I (*commissioner*), recommend denial of Special Use Permit 2025-014 to operate an outdoor establishment. The outdoor venue is associated with the Silverland Inn and will include a variety of scheduled uses and special events. The property is located at 100 N. E Street, Virginia City, Nevada, Assessor's Parcel Number (APN) 001-152-04, 001-154-03 and 001-151-02.





Pursuant to NRS 354.6245, the Department of Taxation is charged with the review of all annual audits to determine their compliance with statutes and/or regulations. The Department must also identify all violations of statute and/or regulations reported therein.

On January 6, 2025, the Department received the annual audit report Fiscal Year 2024. In our review of your audit, we identified violations of NRS 354.626 that were noted by your auditor on page 41 (Section II. B. of the Notes) of the audit report. The following Special Revenue funds exceeded budget appropriations by the actual expenditure/expenses in the amount listed below:

•	Drug Court	\$40.00
٠	Equipment Acquisition	\$19,619

• Federal/State Grant \$53,053

Also, we noted a Financial Statement finding consisting of a negative ending fund balance for the Emergency Mitigation Special Revenue Fund. This finding was not stated in the audit report. Per the entity's 1/29/25 email, an error was made in the transfers for this fund which caused this discrepancy.

Per NRS 354.6245, within 60 days after delivery of the annual audit to the local government, the governing body shall advise the Department of Taxation on what action(s) have been taken to prevent recurrence of violation(s) of law or regulation and to correct each continuing violation(s). Also, each governing body (per NAC 354.721) shall submit with its proposed plan of correction a statement of the date on which it reviewed and approved the plan for submission to the Department.

- <u>Staff Summary:</u> To support SCFPD's operational needs, the FY 2025/2026 CIP includes the proposed acquisition of a tractor and trailer to modernize and support the expansion of the Wildland Division fleet. This acquisition was previously approved to utilize available Capital Projects Funds in FY 2024/2025 for the unbudgeted purchase of these items, not to exceed \$300,000. After analyzing actual quotations and total costs through numerous vendors, it has been determined that purchasing "factory new" equipment is more beneficial than "like-new" used equipment. The purchase of "factory new" equipment represents an increase of approximately \$40,000 from the original \$300,000 approved. This increase cost includes manufacture service and warranty that would not be included with "like-new" used equipment.
- Additionally, the "factory new" equipment that is specified would significantly enhance the quality, capabilities, and durability of the purchased products. Investing in high-quality products with long service lives is in the best interest of SCFPD, as it ensures reliability, reduces maintenance costs, and minimizes the need for frequent replacements. This funding increase would ensure that the acquired equipment was of the highest quality and standard, ultimately leading to cost savings over time. While the initial cost may be higher, the long-term financial and operational benefits outweigh the expenses associated with lower quality alternatives. Therefore, prioritizing quality in purchasing decisions is a strategic approach that supports sustainability, efficiency, and long-term profitability. As a result, I recommend that we take the necessary steps to refer these accounts to a collections agency to ensure recovery of these funds and to minimize further financial impact on the Fire District.

RESOLUTION NO. 25-765

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF STOREY COUNTY, NEVADA, REQUESTING THE NEVADA DELEGATION TO ADVANCE FEDERAL PUBLIC LANDS LEGISLATION COMMONLY REFERRED TO AS THE TRUCKEE MEADOWS PUBLIC LANDS MANAGEMENT ACT TO SUPPORT CONSERVATION, RECREATION AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT IN WASHOE COUNTY.

WHEREAS, the greater Truckee Meadows area has seen and continues to see substantial growth, which will require employment, housing, and recreational opportunities; and,

WHEREAS, Washoe County has millions of acres of public lands (83%) that provide important recreational opportunities including hiking, camping, horseback riding, off-highway vehicle use, hunting, and fishing; and,

WHEREAS, comprehensive public lands legislation will expand recreational opportunities in Washoe County by providing lands and funding for parks, trails and recreational facilities while preserving existing recreational uses; and,

WHEREAS, these public lands provide numerous jobs and important economic contributions to communities throughout the region and support our outdoor recreation economy through tourism, as well as grazing, energy development, mining and other economic activities which are vital to our quality of life and make our region a desirable place to live, work and recreate; and,

WHEREAS, comprehensive public lands legislation that is consistent with the Truckee Meadows Regional Plan and the Storey County Master Plan will support vital economic development now and into the future within a disposal boundary area which will make available public lands for sale and development to encourage infill development utilizing existing infrastructure to address housing demands and affordability, while preserving open space, protecting cultural resources, improving access to recreational areas and providing locally-directed resources to preserve and enhance existing infrastructure; and,

WHEREAS, comprehensive public lands legislation will further conservation by appropriately designating wilderness areas to ensure that each area is qualified as appropriate, responsible and manageable pursuant to the 1964 Wilderness Act. It will provide locally directed funding for conservation activities including habitat improvements for the protection and enhancement of wildlife resources and maintaining and improving access for outdoor recreation; and,

WHEREAS, comprehensive public lands legislation addressing recreation, economic development, and conservation has provided important benefits to counties across Nevada, and can provide important benefits to Washoe County, Storey County, and the Region; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Desert Research Institute Study issued in December 2019, construction of the proposed La Posada Extension connecting I-80 with La Posada Drive will create a much more efficient road system providing an alternative commuting route which will result in a significant reduction in greenhouse gas emissions and energy consumption.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that we, as the Commissioners of Storey County support the Nevada Congressional Delegation and other diverse stakeholders in developing a well-balanced approach to comprehensive public land management legislation to support a growing community and promote sound policies to preserve the quality of life for which the Truckee Meadows and northern Nevada are known.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Storey County Commission supports the enactment of comprehensive public lands legislation to promote conservation, recreation and economic development to achieve important conservation goals, facilitate job creation and enhance the Region's quality of life; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Storey County respectfully requests Senators Cortez-Masto and Rosen and Congressman Amodei to secure the introduction and enactment of well-balanced, comprehensive public lands legislation for Washoe County that considers the needs of current and future residents.


